Carbon Reduction Plan guidance

Notes for completion

Where an in-scope organisation has determined that the measure applies to the procurement, suppliers wishing to bid for that contract are required, as a condition of participation, to submit a CRP which details their organisational carbon footprint and confirms their commitment to achieving net zero by 2050.

CRPs are to be completed by the bidding supplier and must meet the reporting requirements set out in supporting guidance and include the supplier's current carbon footprint and its commitment to reducing emissions to achieve net zero emissions by 2050.¹¹

The CRP should be specific to the bidding entity, or, provided certain criteria are met, may cover the bidding entity and its parent organisation. In order to ensure the CRP remains relevant, a CRP covering the bidding entity and its parent organisation is only permissible where the detailed requirements of the CRP are met in full, as set out in the Technical Standard¹² and Guidance, and all of the following criteria are met:

- the bidding entity is wholly owned by the parent
- the commitment to achieving net zero by 2050 for UK operations is set out in the CRP for the parent and is supported and adopted by the bidding entity, demonstrated by the inclusion in the CRP of a statement that this will apply to the bidding entity
- the environmental measures set out are stated to be able to be applied by the bidding entity when performing the relevant contract
- the CRP is published on the bidding entity's website

Bidding entities must take steps to ensure they have their own CRP as soon as reasonably practicable and should note that the ability to rely on a parent organisation's CRP may only be a temporary measure to satisfy this particular condition of participation.

The CRP should be updated regularly (at least annually) and published and clearly signposted on the supplier's UK website. It should be approved by a director (or equivalent senior leadership) within the supplier's organisation to demonstrate a clear commitment to emissions reduction at the highest level. Suppliers may wish to adopt the objectives of the CRP within their strategic plans.

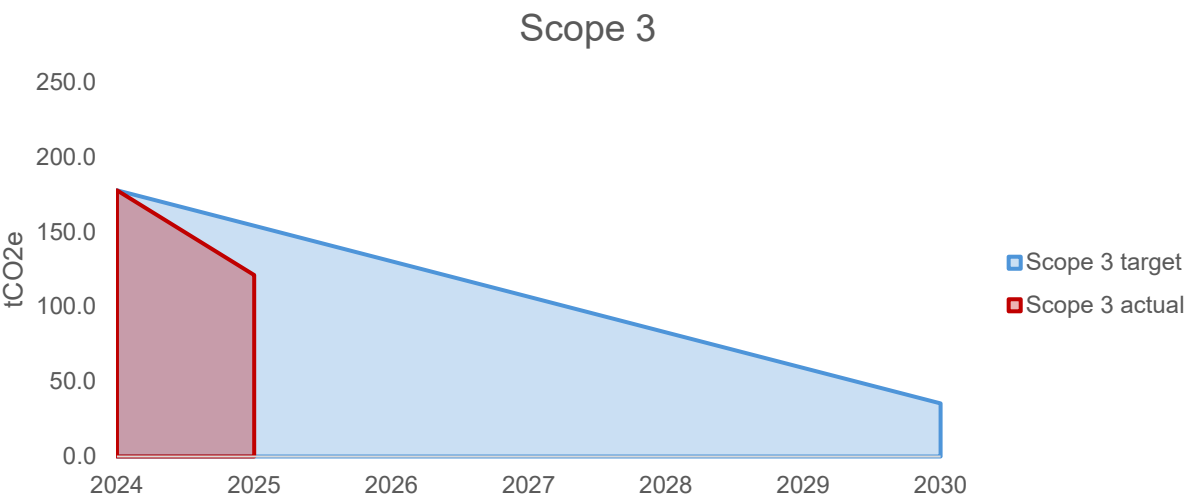
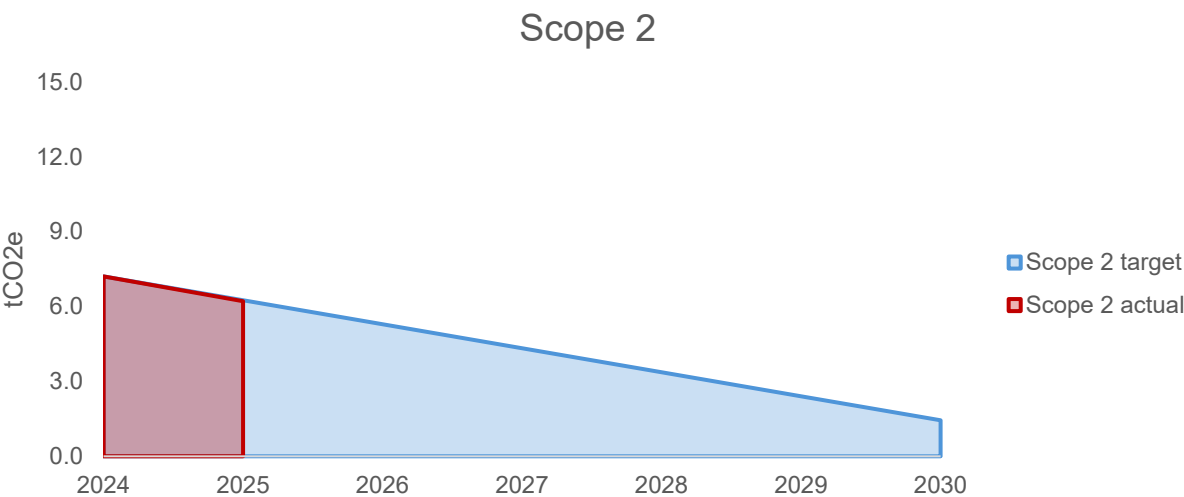
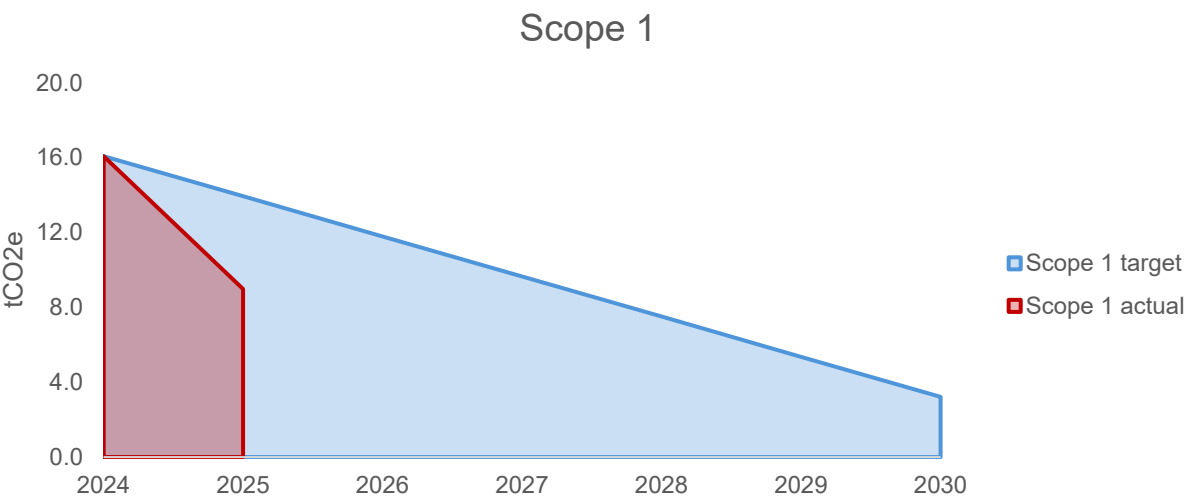

Emissions reduction targets

In order to continue our progress to achieving net zero, we have adopted the following carbon reduction targets.

We project that carbon emissions will decrease over the next five years to 40 tCO₂e by 2030. This is a reduction of 80%.



Carbon reduction projects

Completed carbon reduction initiatives

The following environmental management measures and projects have been completed or implemented since the 2024 baseline and will remain in effect when performing the contract. The following environmental management measures have been implemented since the 2024 baseline and will remain in effect when performing the contract.

- Installation of an electric vehicle charging point at our Salisbury head office to support employees transitioning to lower-emission vehicles.
- Continued operation of our Environmental Management System aligned to ISO 14001:2015, incorporating environmental objectives, operational controls, monitoring and management review.
- Continued use of remote meetings and virtual collaboration technologies to reduce unnecessary business travel.
- Improved the calculation of our carbon footprint using updated emissions factors and more accurate activity data.

Future carbon reduction initiatives

In the future we hope to implement further measures such as:

- Working towards reducing our use of desflurane, a volatile anaesthetic gas used in surgery.
- Upgrading our equipment and lighting across our facilities to install LED lights
- We rent or use space from several NHS trusts who supply us with energy as part of our agreement with them. All partner trusts have plans to reduce carbon in line with the NHS carbon reduction plan. We are encouraging these partners to use renewable electricity for their facilities.
- Planting pollinator, drought-friendly plants using peat-free compost at our Salisbury site
- Switching to green energy suppliers at facilities and locations where this is possible
- Cycle to work schemes to encourage our employees to not use carbon emitting methods of commuting
- Introducing reprocessed high value single use medical devices to reduce our waste carbon emissions from our supply chain
- Continue to improve the quality and coverage of Scope 3 emissions data, including supplier and purchased-goods information where proportionate and available.

Declaration and sign off

This Carbon Reduction Plan has been completed in accordance with PPN 006 and associated guidance and reporting standard for Carbon Reduction Plans.

Emissions have been reported and recorded in accordance with the published reporting standard for Carbon Reduction Plans and the GHG Reporting Protocol corporate standard¹³ and uses the appropriate government emission conversion factors for greenhouse gas company reporting.¹⁴

Scope 1 and Scope 2 emissions have been reported in accordance with SECR requirements (where required), and the required subset of Scope 3 emissions have been reported in accordance with the published reporting standard for Carbon Reduction Plans and the Corporate Value Chain (Scope 3) Standard.¹⁵
